- 1. In order to take a dual credit course(s) through Howard College (listed above), the student and parent must sign this contract and return a completed Pre-Registration form.
- 2. The student must also meet "college readiness standards" through one of the following TSIA2 (Texas Success Initiative) Requirements:
 - STAAR Students can be exempt from one or more TSLA2 tests via the following STAAR test scores: English II STAAR – 4000 or higher = exemption from TSIA2 ELAR Algebra I STAAR – 4000 or higher (+ completion of Algebra 2) = exemption from TSIA2 Math test
 - ACT 23 Composite Score, with no lower than a 19 on the English (ELAR) and Math sections
 - SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) = 530 Math and/or 480 EBRW (ELAR)

3. If the student does not meet one of the criteria listed above, then he/she must plan to take the TSIA2 test (and provide proof to the CHS Counseling Center that the student received the following scores) by the time of registration:

For English, Social Studies, Science, and Speech DC courses: College Readiness Classification Test (CRC) ELAR Score of 945 with a 5 on the essay; or a 910 with a 5 on the essay section + a 5 on the Diagnostic Test (DT) section

For Math DC Courses: CRC Math score of 950; or a 910 + a 6 on the DT section

After Spring STAAR scores become available, CHS will identify students who need to take the TSIA2 test. CHS will mail testing information to students who need to test in the summer. TSIA2 information is also available on the CHS Counseling Center website.

- 4. College professors have the authority to establish their own policies and procedures for their courses, separate and apart from SAISD policies (how/when to report grades, how to weigh their assignments, projects, tests, etc.)
- 5. Long Term Carver placement may result in removal from Dual Credit course(s) [into grade level course(s)].
- 6. Educational records cannot be released by Howard College personnel without the student's written permission.

- 7. Dropping a Howard Dual Credit Course will result in the following:
 - If the student chooses to drop a Dual Credit course, the student will generally be placed in a grade level course. There is no guarantee that the student will be placed in a new class during the same class period (due to class availability).
 - For online courses, no tuition refund will be issued for drops on or after the first day of the semester. If the student is on the payment plan, they will still be expected to continue making payments on the dropped course.
 - A "W" will appear on the student's transcript if the course is dropped after census date, approximately 12 class days.
 - A grade of "W" could affect future financial aid eligibility. It is the student's responsibility to determine the impact the drop will have on prospective college admissions.
 - A grade will appear on the student's transcript if the course is dropped during the last two weeks (approximately) of the <u>college</u> semester.
 - Dropping before the last day of the semester will result in the loss of weighted points.
 - The student's dual credit grade will follow him/her to the new grade level class.
 - Dropping with a failing grade could affect a student's eligibility to participate in extra-curricular activities.
- 8. Students may transfer from a CHS Dual Credit course to a Lake View HS DC course only during the first 2 weeks of the course. College guidelines do not allow students to change course sections after the 2nd week of the course.
- 9. Howard has access to transcript and schedule information for all Dual Credit Students.
- 10. Students who take courses on Howard's campus must provide proof of their Meningitis vaccination.
- 11. It is the responsibility of the student to inform Howard College personnel (including Professor/Teacher) of any need for classroom/testing accommodations. Accommodations must be related to a diagnosed disability. FMI call Howard Support Services (325)481-8300 ext. 3405. Please see your CHS counselor for any questions.
- 12. A minimum number of minutes of seat time is required for college credit, therefore excessive absences could endanger the opportunity to receive course credit.
- 13. <u>Students taking Howard courses online are responsible for buying their own textbooks (including online access codes)</u> for some dual credit classes, including Summer, Mini-mesters, Online courses, and classes on Howard College campus. **Additional costs can be \$100 or more**.
- 14. Howard charges double the prices that are listed below (prices subject to change). During the regular school year (Aug May) SAISD pays half of the student's tuition (more for students on free or reduced lunch) for students taking academic classes. Therefore, each student in these courses receives an SAISD scholarship for at least 50% of his/her tuition. As a result, Howard will send each DC student/parent a 1098-T tax form in January, so that this scholarship can be reported on your income tax return.
- 15. Students who wish to take any course(s) during the Summer or when SAISD is not in session (Minimester), must pay the full Howard tuition rates. Tuition rates for these types of classes are double the prices listed (prices subject to change).

Dual Credit and Early Admission Enrollment Agreement

As a dual credit/early admission student (or as a parent/legal guardian of the student), I understand and agree to the following:

- 1. This form is valid for the duration of a student's participation in the dual credit/early admission program.
- 2. In order to enroll and receive college credit for dual credit/early admission courses, a student must meet guidelines of the high school and the college and be approved to take dual credit/early admission courses.
- 3. A student must follow all policies of Howard College and the school district.
- 4. The SSN provided above may be used to update my Howard College records, if not previously provided.
- 5. All forms and documentation, including: Howard College Application for Admission, Student/Parent Agreement, and test scores (TSI, STAAR EOC, PSAT/NMSQT, PLAN or ACT/SAT) must be submitted before enrollment/registration.
- 6. Requirements of the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) must be met for the subject area(s) that correspond to the courses I wish to take.
- 7. A student must remain enrolled in high school.
- 8. A student is not officially enrolled until all required registration documents and payment have been submitted to the college. Payment is due at the time of enrollment. If payment is not made at that time, a student may be dropped for non-payment.
- 9. Dual credit/early admission courses are college-level. **College level courses may include** controversial, sensitive and/or adult material. Students are expected to have readiness for college level rigor and content.
- 10. A student must notify Howard College by completing the withdrawal process by the last date to withdraw (see college calendar) if they decide to drop or withdraw from courses.
- 11. A student may be enrolled in interactive videoconference classes that are transmitted from the college to the high school if scheduled by the high school. These classes may be recorded and uploaded to a password-protected website link.

12. Proctoring may be required for students enrolled in online courses.

13. Grades earned in dual credit courses become part of a student's permanent academic record and will be reflected on the college transcript.

14. A student will not receive an official Howard College transcript until an official transcript from the high school is submitted to the college that includes a graduation date.

15. A student's signature below gives the high school permission to send to Howard College all required test scores, enrollment documentation, as well as a final transcript upon graduation.
